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Introducing A Pastoral Break

reflect – refocus – renew

Thank you for your interest in A Pastoral Break. I hope this information will help you to decide if this is the right thing for you at this time, and to make plans.

Who?

A Pastoral Break is for anyone looking for a short time away from their work, who feels a need for reflection, renewal and a new sense of focus. Perhaps you're aware of how much is changing for you, or are contemplating a change; perhaps you're simply tired or jaded.

What?

A pastoral break is just that: a break from your work with the twin aim of taking care of yourself – body, mind and soul – and of reflecting on what you're doing in your work and what it's doing to you. It comprises three nights bed and breakfast in a guest house in Elgin, Moray, and three sessions of pastoral supervision (see below for more about Pastoral Supervision.)

Why?

Leading and listening, managing and caring: your work involves all of these and more. It's important to not only have time off that is nourishing but also to intentionally reflect on your work, your vision for it and what really matters for you in it. You may feel a need to reflect on what has changed for you and those you work with as a result of COVID-19.

Where?

The West End Guest House in Elgin: good food at breakfast and a comfortable bed! The gentle countryside and coast of Moray offers you space and fresh air. There are forests, hills and beaches, historical sites, etc, plus good places to eat in town. The Guest House is 10 minute's walk from Elgin Railway and Bus Stations. www.westendguesthouse.co.uk

When?

A Pastoral Break could be very appropriate at certain points in working life: when contemplating or facing a change; after a challenging time or when envisioning plans for the future. How?

How much? The cost is £240. We appreciate payment before you arrive. If you need to cancel, we will return the payment but if you cancel within 48 hours of arrival I'm sorry we cannot make a refund.

What is Pastoral Supervision?

Pastoral supervision is attentive to the impact of your work upon you as a person and the vision and values that ground you. It is not counselling, spiritual direction or advice-giving: it is your time and space to bring what you want to bring, with openness to challenge and development. It will be a safe space and time to be listened to, reflect and be renewed. In

addition to the supervision sessions, people on a pastoral break have used the time to read, study, or walk. More information will be sent to you ahead of your break.
