Steven Mithen has a BA (hons) in Prehistory & Archaeology from Sheffield University, an MSc in Biological Computation from York University and a PhD in Archaeology from Cambridge University. Between 1987 and 1992 he was a Research Fellow at Trinity Hall and then Lecturer in Archaeology at Cambridge. After moving to the University of Reading, he was promoted to Senior Lecturer (1996), Reader (1998) and then Professor of Early Prehistory (2000). In August 2002 he was appointed as the first Head of the School of Human & Environmental Sciences, formed by the Departments of Archaeology, Geography, Soil Science and the Postgraduate Institute of Sedimentology, a post he held until August 2008 when he became Dean of the Faculty of Science. In 2018 Steven completed his management roles at the University and returned to the Department of Archaeology as Professor Early Prehistory. He was elected as a Fellow of the British Academy in 2004.



Educated at Oxford (BA, MA & DPhil) and St Andrews (BD) Universities, Ian Bradley has had a varied career in full-time journalism, broadcasting, writing, academia and ministry. He is Emeritus Professor of Cultural and Spiritual History at the University of St Andrews where he was Principal of St Mary's College, taught church history and practical theology and was honorary Church of Scotland chaplain for twenty years. He continues to be an active Church of Scotland minister, regularly taking services and preaching. He is the author of over forty books, ranging in subject matter from academic theology and religious and cultural history to popular spirituality, music and contemporary politics. He regularly contributes the Credo column in The Times and writes and reviews for the Church Times and Modern Believing.



Dr Sally Foster is Senior Lecturer in Heritage and Conservation, History, Heritage and Politics at the University of Stirling, and an active contributor to the University's Cultural Heritage research programme. She spent over 20 years working in cultural heritage - mainly for Historic Scotland - before returning to academia in 2010. Graduating from University College London with a degree in Medieval Archaeology, she completed her archaeology PhD at the University of Glasgow. Before joining Stirling in 2014, she was an archaeology lecturer at Glasgow and Aberdeen universities.
